TRUSTEES UPDATE

We are well underway with our 2020 Budget planning in preparation for our upcoming Financial meeting on February 23rd at 11AM. We encourage everyone to submit your pledges for 2020 since our annual budget is based on pledges and we are considerably under last year pledges by \$15,000 or 14%.

After many years of faithful service, our Church Fair leaders have stepped back, resigning from their roles. While extending our gratitude to these leaders, we now acknowledge the importance of securing new leaders. Given the budgeted \$10,000 for our fair, in preparing for it moving forward, we need new leaders to help lead this vital fundraising effort. The former chairs pledge to support the fair in helping lead areas of the fair and be available to offer knowledge from their many years of experience. If after prayer and discernment you feel moved to help us lead the fair this year with or without a co-chair, please let Steve Hight and the council know.

At the council in January, the Trustees made a motion to add an agenda item onto the Financial meeting to start work on updating the current upstairs bathroom to a Unisex fully handicap accessible bathroom. We have gone out for bids and will be ready to start this project the first of March, if we get your vote to proceed. We truly believe that updating this bathroom will greatly expand our marketability to draw the community into using our Parish Hall for local functions.

We have started the work on fixing the bathroom walls and painting prior to the town hall usage for early voting in February. They expect between 5000-7000 of Marshfield voters and hope they will be impressed and interested in using our hall for their upcoming functions.


