TO YOU, FROM PASTOR BARTLETT

The weather has caused us a few complications. Seasonal cold temperatures and the increase in fuel prices has caused the Trustees to consider moving services to the parish hall for the remainder of the cold weather season. There are those who feel we might lose momentum if that occurs, so the matter will be discussed this coming week and a decision will be reached.

The Youth Fellowship had a bowling trip on Sunday afternoon. There are plans to consider mission projects to contribute to the overall mission emphasis of the church.

The newly formed Music Task Force is getting organized to manage the church music. We do not have a full time organist and we need to find a way to resource pianists/organists to assist us part time. During the remaining time, we need to be able to select music that can be integrated into our audio visual sanctuary recorded music and hymns with which we can sing along. The idea is to divide the responsibilities for music among the members of the Task Force so that music becomes reliable but does not become too much of a burden for any one participant.

We were all saddened at the passing of Georgia and Dave's son Corey due to complications from COVID. Condolences have already been sent from many places. There will be a Memorial Service at the church in June, 2022.

The LBS and the Thrift and Gift continue a special ministry to those in need. Their generous support of the church is especially appreciated at this time.

Confirmation classes continue with a weekend workshop scheduled for February involving the sharing of the wisdom of our members with the class on various subject matters such as The Apostles' Creed, The Ten Commandments, The Lord's Prayer, Psalm 23, the Beatitudes, Church History, and the Theory of Evolution.

The Caring Ministry continues to follow the church members by praying for the sick, making phone calls, and sending cards of caring. The missions committee has been busy with providing clothing for the homeless and supporting other missionary endeavors. A NACCC effort to send relief to the recent tornado victims in the South was met with a contribution from our Deacons' Fund.

Our mission remains moving forward together to fulfill the Great Commission by holding to "the mission of the church to witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ in all the world, while worshipping God, and striving for the truth, justice and peace" We realize that we are in another COVID year, but look forward to the decline of the virus and the removal of restrictions to our ministerial efforts.

May our vision include outreach to our community to bring hope, life, and peace to so many who are looking to find the love, joy, and peace that only Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit can provide.

Let us move forward through the depths of winter, howbeit at a reduced speed, to spring up in new growth, spiritually, as the weather warms and nature revives.

FROM THE THRIFT AND GIFT



Now in its 4th month, our Confirmation program is going "strong," as confirmands continue their study of Lee Strobel's book, "The Case for Christ."

Summary to date:

Strobel is a non-believing (atheist) investigative reporter for the Chicago Tribune

He used his skills to try to disprove that Jesus Christ was the savior described in the scriptures.

He investigated whether Jesus believed he was God and concluded He did believe that.

He investigated whether Jesus fit the psychological definition of being mentally ill and concluded Jesus was not crazy.

A summary on chapter 4 – Did Jesus Match the Identify of the Messiah?

The Old Testament first tells of the coming of a Messiah in Deuteronomy when Moses tells his fellow Israelites: "The Lord said to me: ... I will raise up for them a prophet like you (Moses) from among their fellow Israelites, and I will put my words in his mouth. He will tell them everything I command him. I myself will call to account anyone who does not listen to my words that the prophet speaks in my name."

Generations later we find in the Jewish Scriptures [Old Testament (OT)] several dozens of prophecies (predictions) about the Messiah and His coming. These predictions gave the Israelites a way to recognize the real Messiah, rule out imposters, and check the credentials of the authentic Messiah.

Isaiah 53 gives a perfect description of the man we call Jesus, yet it was written more than 700 years before His birth. In Micah we find the Messiah's birthplace, Jeremiah offers His family tree, Zechariah notes the price of His betrayal, and Psalm 22 predicts the lots cast for Jesus' garments. The probability of even just eight OT prophecies being fulfilled in one person would be a hundred million billion! Jesus himself said that "Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms." What do you think? Does Jesus fit the prophecies?

Strobel concluded in chapter 4:

There are dozens of prophecies about Jesus' coming and what would happen to him. Many scriptures give a perfect description of Jesus

The probability of anyone matching every prophecy is 1 in 100,000,000,000,000,000, but Jesus does! In February we will study Chapter 5 to ponder whether we can trust Christ's biographies.



SUNDAY SCHOOL: 1ST STOP: EXODUS

With the recent passing of Miss Georgia's son, Corey, our new curriculum in Exodus got off to a late start. January 30 will be our first stop. Through their journey in the Old Testament, kids will see how so long- ago, God claimed his people and taught them lessons of truth.


#1 Jan 30: "Princess of Egypt" - Keep hoping in God, even when times are hard
#2 Feb 6: "The Reluctant Prince" - When God gives us a job, he'll give us the help
#3 Feb13: "The Duel Begins" - God is bigger and more powerful than anyone
#4 Feb 20: "The God of Light and Life" - God takes care of us
We will connect the dots with the New Testament too.
