EXPLORING WHO WE ARE IN CHRIST

This Lenten season at FCC Marshfield, we will be digging deep, as we continue the conversation of exploring who we are as Congregational Christians loving and serving God and God's people today. On March 29, we will conclude our BCE-sponsored adult education series on The Congregational Way with a facilitated discussion on Fellowship (the topics of Faith and Freedom were engaged in Jan. and Feb.). In tandem with this educational discussion, we will embark on a Lenten Sermon series on the Biblical roots and underpinnings of Congregationalism. 
ECUMENICAL COMMUNION SERVICE AT TEA ROCK GARDENS

Girzone's fictional parable is moving and thought-provoking. A TRIBUTE TO IVY MACCALLUM

Our sister, Ivy MacCallum was a member of FCCM for six years, where she served in the Hart Bell Choir, as Secretary of the Missions and Outreach Committee, and as the youngest member of the Ladies Benevolent Society. She loved attending the Marshfield Senior Center, where she learned quilting, played bingo, and knit. Ivy was also an avid reader and went everywhere with a book in her purse. Three years ago, Ivy moved to Tea Rock Gardens, marking her first time living alone. She made many friends at Tea Rock. Ivy had a zest for life, and despite her challenges, she was always upbeat and cheerful. Ivy was a good friend to everyone she met. She was diagnosed with epilepsy at age two, an illness that eventually took her life. Ivy was one of four children and a mother to two sons. She was a compassionate friend who went out of her way to help others. Ivy's many interests included cooking, baking, and ballet. She always faced challenges with courage and optimism, and her deep faith sustained her through difficult times. On Jan. 29, 2020, Ivy went to her rest in the Lord. Her death shocked us all, especially me. I will miss her greatly although I know she is at eternal rest with the Lord and is no longer suffering. Rest in peace, Ivy. We love you.
