Winter weather has increased our heating and snow removal costs, giving us a slight cash flow deficit which should disappear once the warmer weather comes. We are half way through the month of March and, while we cannot guarantee a major weather change for the better, we are much closer than we were.

The Tuesday Bible Study is well under way with provisions for in person and Remote Zoom participation.

Church attendance last Sunday with the bitter cold and the time change for daylight saving was 47 with several new attendees. This bodes well as we move out of COVID into more favorable times for congregational meeting.

The ecumenical Good Friday Service we are hosting will follow our traditional Tenebrae Service the preceding evening. There will be an Easter Sunrise Service led by the youth as in times past followed by our Easter Service in the Meeting House at 9:30 am.

We are continuing to look for ways to grow the church and develop discipleship programs.

Graduation will be coming soon and we will have some scholarships to be awarded.

The Confirmation program continues with a retreat coming up in May and regular monthly meetings.

Sunday School continues to provide a spiritual environment for our attendees.

Plans are underway to have a church fair task force.

Youth Fellowship continues to have regular meetings, activities, and service projects.

LBS and the Thrift and Gift continue to provide significant income for the church as well as provide a service for the community.

We are in as good shape as we can be after surviving a pandemic, but our challenge for the future is much greater as we realize so many people do not have a close relationship with God and the church. May God continue to bless our efforts as we move forward together.

FROM YOUR DEACONS

In conjunction with the Board of Christian Education, we initiated a 7-week Lenten Bible study on each Tuesday during Lent. We are very pleased with the response and turn out from the congregation. Our first study had 17 participants! We wish to thank the newly formed music committee for securing the services of Doug Ulwick who will provide Organ music for Easter and selected worship services in lent.

After the worship service on Sunday March 20th we celebrated our first baptism of the year. We baptized Bennet Rocha, son of Caithlin Chandler Rocha and Matt Rocha.

The Deacons are busily preparing for Easter and all the events of Holy Week. There will be a Palm Parade on Palm Sunday. The Maundy Thursday Tenebrae service will be at 7pm on April 14th. All of the churches in Marshfield will be joining us for a Good Friday Ecumenical Service at Noon on April 15th. And don't forget about the youth led Sunrise service on Burkes Beach Easter morning followed by our traditional Easter Sunday service at 9:30 am. We hope that you will plan to join us, in person, for all these reverent services. Please note that there will be no coffee hour on Easter Sunday to allow everyone to get home to their family celebrations.

Thanks to your careful observation of our Covid protocols there has not been a single Covid transmission attributable to our church to date. As Covid infections decline we observe that many towns and communities are loosening restrictions. We are keeping a close eye on the situation and reviewing our policies regularly. Masks are not required but will continue to be made available to anyone who wants one. If things continue to trend downward, we will reestablish our traditional "Passing of the Peace" by May (if not sooner) but for now will keep it contactless. We thank the congregation for their flexibility during this time. If you cannot join us in person, please join us on Facebook Live. Give us a "like" or a "love" to let us know you are there and feel free to comment your prayer requests.

We have invited Reverend Bob Jackson to be our guest minister for May 22. More details to follow.

FROM YOUR TRUSTEES

We have been busy with the annual budget and planning sessions this last month. Thank you all for your support.

Now we have directed our attention on fundraising and planning to replace the Sanctuary windows. Initial investigations have estimated the Anderson windows will cost \$3,000 each and will take 14 months to be available. We have put out requests for bid for the installation costs and will have the contractors get us the final measurements for size.

We have requested to have a special meeting on April 24th right after service to discuss the final costs and our fundraising plans to help us bring this project to fruition. We currently have already raised just over \$19k dollars and need another \$11 k to place the order for the windows. Short term we are hoping that people will consider working in groups to help fund the cost of a window. The next phase would be to consider what we could do to help raise the additional money through several different fundraising efforts like we did when we replaced the Steeple.

We have also been working on the church records. The old Financial Secretaries records have been shredded, the booking aged records are being weeded through and will be shredded soon. Making room for the church historical records to be returned to the church. The clerk records and database will be returned to the office and maintained by the church administrator, with oversight by the current clerk.



Now We are 6 months into our Confirmation program, and Leah and Emma continue to work hard as they study Lee Strobel's book, "The Case for Christ." Chapter 1: We learn that atheist and investigative reporter, Lee Strobel, tries to disprove that Jesus Christ was the savior described in the scriptures. <a href="Chapter 2:"Did Jesus really Think He was God?": After an exhaustive investigation, Strobel concluded Jesus stated emphatically in the scriptures that he was.

<u>Chapter 3: "Was Jesus Crazy to Claim he was God?":</u> After conferring with world-renowned psychologists whether Jesus fit the psychological definition of having a mental illness, he concluded Jesus did NOT fit even one of the clinical criterion for mental illness and he was NOT crazy.

Chapter 4: "Did Jesus Match the Identify of the Messiah?": Strobel discovered there were dozens of prophecies regarding Jesus' birth, birthplace, crucifixion, His resurrection, etc., and the probability of anyone matching even 8 of these is only one in 100 million billion (100,000,000,000,000,000)! Scriptures written 700+ years before His birth give a perfect description of the savior. Isaiah 53 for one.

<u>Chapter 5: "Can you Trust Christ's Biographies?"</u> Strobel found that the 1st four books of the New Testament were "scientifically-certified,"* as ancient historical documents recording Jesus' life, because:

- 1. They were written by eyewitnesses or people who interviewed eyewitnesses. None had anything to gain, but everything to lose for their writings.
- 2. Not one of countless living eyewitnesses discredited their writings.
- 3. Inaccuracy could not account for the radical transformations of the authors, apostles, and followers affected by Jesus.
- 4. In more than 24,000 ancient, Biblical transcripts in about 10 languages, the number of variations were negligible (about .005%), minor, and non-material. Miraculously, they ALL concluded Jesus was the Son of God. Today's Bible is an accurate copy of the original writings.

Chapter 6: Is There a Case for Christ outside the Bible? Strobel discovered there was! Both Jewish and Non-Jewish historians, believers and non-believers, corroborated the Bible in their writings. There is so much archaeological evidence showing the Bible to be accurate. In fact, no archaeological evidence, to date, has disproved any of it. Sir William Ramsey, an atheist and one of history's greatest archaeologists, spent 25 years trying to disprove the book of Acts, only to conclude that Luke, author of Acts, was one of the most accurate historians ever. He was so impressed that he became a Christian. Another noted archaeologist looked into Luke's references of 32 countries, 54 cities and 5 islands, and did not find one mistake. Current evidence includes the reality of how many thousands of lives have been totally changed/turned around, when they discovered Christ.

* Renowned historians (believers and non-beliers) over the centuries almost always used the Bible as a primary reference because of its near-perfect accuracy historically, archeologically, and geographically.

Maundy Thursday Tenebrae Service (April 14th @ 7pm)

The Worship service of Tenebrae, meaning "darkness" or "shadows," has been practiced by the Church for centuries, dating back to the medieval period.

Tenebrae grew to become an important part of Worship for all people of the Church during Holy Week, typically being celebrated near the end of

Holy Week. Tenebrae is a meditation on Christ's suffering. Scripture readings and musical selections outline the story of Christ's passion. As lights are extinguished, we ponder the depth of Christ's suffering and death; we remember the cataclysmic nature of His sacrifice as we hear the striking sound of the "strepitus" (representing the earthquake upon Jesus' death); and through the return of the small but persistent flame of the Christ candle at the conclusion of the liturgy, we anticipate the joy of ultimate victory. The service concludes in darkness, except for a final candle, the Christ candle, carried out of the sanctuary, symbolizing the death of Jesus.



Good Friday Ecumenical Service (April 15th @ 12pm)

Several Christian Churches throughout Marshfield will join together at FCC Marshfield at noon on Good Friday for an Ecumenical Service to present the last 7 words spoken by Jesus before He died on the cross.

Easter Sunday Sunrise Service (April 17th @ 5:45am)
