

#### FROM YOUR DEACONS

We certainly had an eventful Holy Week and Easter season. We nearly doubled our usual in person attendance for Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday with 46 and 44 people in each service, respectively. Our Maundy Thursday service retained its reverent tone but had many differences due to covid restrictions.

We are fortunate that we diligently kept our Covid restrictions in place as we had a potential Covid contact during our Maundy Thursday service. One of our readers developed symptoms two days after the service and tested positive for Covid on Easter Sunday, meaning that they were contagious during the Thursday night service. Since distancing protocols were in place no one was within 6 feet of the infected person for more than a few minutes. The Marshfield Board of Health was notified but they felt that Covid spread was unlikely due to our mask, distancing, misting/sanitizing, ventilation and contact tracing protocols. All 27 people in attendance were notified of the potential contact and alerted to watch for Covid symptoms. Six people opted to get tested and all tested negative. Approximately one third of the people in attendance had been vaccinated. NONE of the 27 people in attendance developed Covid. Our prudent protocols and the providence of Almighty God kept us safe. Thank you Lord!

This trial by fire has shown us that we are doing everything right to keep our congregation safe. As more people get vaccinated and our comfort levels increase, we have no intentions of letting our guard down. Mask and distancing will still be enforced. Communion will still be in pre-packaged elements and coffee hour will still be forbidden.

If you have any questions or concerns please reach out to one of your Deacons. The physical and spiritual health of the congregation remains our primary focus.

#### IN-PERSON & LIVESTREAM WORSHIP SERVICE

#### -Sundays at 9:30am

NACCC recommendations on indoor Worship indicate that ventilation is key if we are to keep our churches open and safe from COVID-19 virus transmission this winter. Please be advised that in observance of this recommendation, we will be keeping the narthex entry door and the four windows at the front of the church OPEN during Worship for ventilation. The congregation is encouraged to dress warmly and keep hats, coats and gloves on to stay comfortable during Worship as the weather gets colder. The Meeting House thermostat has been lowered to 50 degrees. This will help with ventilation while also avoid wasting heat. There will be no corporate singing of hymns and bulletins will not be printed and handed out. (You may print you own or access on your mobile device.) Between services an industrial disinfectant sprayer will be used to sanitize the Meeting House. All of our services will continue to be livestreamed on Facebook Live and available for viewing later. While we are very excited about staying open this winter, we are also fully aware of our obligation to ensure the health and safety of all who attend. We will continue to encourage online sign-ups. All are asked to sign up in advance by either calling the church office or sign up online through The Pilgrim email. Note that our capacity will be limited as per state guidelines, and that masks and 6-foot social distancing will still be required (Only two persons allowed per pew, although members of the same immediate household may be seated together). There will be no fellowship time following service. Childcare will not be provided at this time. All over the age of 5 are asked to wear a mask. Washing stations and restrooms will continue to be made available on the lower level of the Parish Hall. We look forward to joining you in Worship!



#### JOHN ELIOT LETTER FROM ROXBURY THIS 12 OF NOV. 1648

The Indians about us which I constantly teach, do still diligently and deliriously attend, and in a good measure practice (for the outward part of Religion , both in their families and Sabbaths) according to their knowledge; and by degrees come on to labor. I should be over tedious and troublesome to you to run into particulars, only let mt give you a taste of their knowledge by their questions, a few whereof I did sometimes jot down, though I slipped many and very material ones; these questions being asked at sundry times , and at sundry meetings of the Indians.

Question: How many good people were in Sodom when it was burnt?

I know not how to pray to Christ and the Spirit, I know a little how to pray to God?

Doth the Devil dwell in us as we dwell in a house?

When God saith, Honor thy Father, doth he mean three fathers: our Father, and our Sachim and God?

When the Soul goes to heaven, what doth i say when it comes there? And what doth a wicked Soul say when it commeth unto Hell?

If one sleep on the Sabbath at meeting and another awaketh him, and he be angry at it and say, it is because he so doth, is it not a sin?

If any talk of another man's faults, and tell others of it when he is prsent to answer, is not that a sin?

Why did Christ die in our stead?

Seeing Eve was first in sin, whether did she die first?

Why must we love our enemies and how shall we do it?

How doth Christ redeem and deliver us from sin?

When every day my heart thinks I must die and go to hell for my sins, what shall I do in this case?

May a good man sin sometimes? Or may he be a good man and yet sin sometimes?

If a man think a prayer, doth God know it, and will he bess him?

Who killed Christ?

*If you have nothing to share; then share yourself...* purchasing any of our plants at the sale will benefit FCCM. Thank you for your continued support of our fundraising efforts!


